Virginia Mason's Project Planning Team collaborated to create a planning process and template Event Action Plan for 30+ electrical shutdowns impacting hospital operations. The planning process included meetings, walk-throughs and dry runs ahead of each shutdown ensuring that impacts were identified and mitigated. Communications plans assured if a problem arose during the shutdown it was quickly addressed. Patient care continued with no increases in Patient Safety Alerts during shutdowns.
